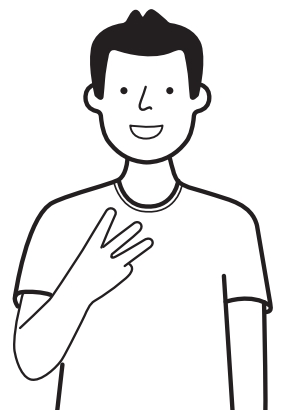

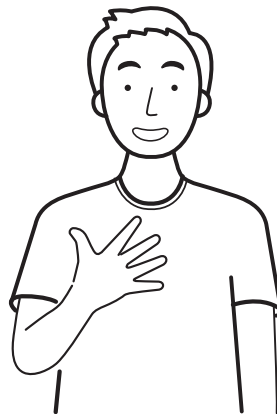

TWO KEY TIPS
