Waving your arms to attract attention

Tapping them on the shoulder, provided you have approval from parents or carers

Using visual cues such as a flashcard

Deploy a buddy system to encourage children to work together

Don't hold your hand over your mouth

Use exagggerated facial expressions and gestures to demonstrate your instructions

Allow time for the child to respond

Pause regularly to check everyone understands

Ask about the DHH child preferred way to communicate and what devices they might use

Face the child at the same level

Limit background noise

Speak naturally, clearly and at a normal rate

Don't shout

When speaking position yourself in a well lit area, don't have the light behind you
